Advisory Committee on the Government Art Collection

Summary of the minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 17 November 2016 at the Government Art Collection

1. Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from David A Bailey, Gabriele Finaldi, Clare Lilley.

David Verey was scheduled to arrive late and so Iwona Blazwick agreed to take the Chair.

2. Minutes of the last Committee meeting held on 14 July 2016

The minutes were agreed and signed.

3. Matters arising

Iwona Blazwick raised the issue of the proposed acquisition prize. The Director suggested that Bloomberg New Contemporaries show might be the best option as it is an annual national touring exhibition and not confined to London. The Committee thought it should be an acquisition rather than a prize and that an indicative price of around £5,000 should be agreed but with some flexibility.

4.3 Approaches made to GAC for consideration

No proposed acquisitions were recommended for purchase.

5. Update on Portrait of Queen Victoria, New Delhi

Andrew Parratt has identified historic links between the work, its donor and possible location – the Dr Bhau Daji Lad Museum (until 1975 the Victoria and Albert Museum) in Mumbai. He has visited and met with museum officials and a representative of the British Council. The Museum was keen to display the work and had identified a prominent location within its building to do so, although they would have to be formally approached and the work would be on long term loan.

The work is in a poor state of repair and would require conservation work. It is hoped that the Hamilton Kerr Institute would undertake the work in tandem with local conservators providing a development opportunity. The Committee suggested ways in which funding might be obtained e.g. local sponsorship, Art Fund or crowd funding.

6. Report on GAC works of art, Ambassador's Residence, Tehran

Andrew Parratt updated the Committee on the works damaged after an attack on the British Embassy compound in Tehran in November 2011.

7. Government Art Collection - Verbal Update

Outset/Government Art Collection Fund

The GAC continues to work with OUTSET to bring new works into the Collection. Discussions are underway with Laure Prouvost to identify one of her works and with Richard Wentworth to finalise the display of one of his works.

Old Admiralty Building (OAB)

There are a number of design elements that remain unresolved, in particular within the small gallery space. The GAC has sought specialist architectural advice to help with this. It is anticipated that the likely occupation date will be 2018.

Advisory Committee Meetings: summary of minutes The Director confirmed that An Eyeful of Wry an exhibition curated by the GAC's Nicky Hodge (Curator of Information and Research, Modern & Contemporary), will be shown in Hull during the city's tenure as UK City of Culture in 2017.
